Race Report: The **Club Championships** are **March 20th**. There are nine classes with the winner of each class getting on the trophy. We run a GS course and classes A & B are scored on a combined two run basis with the rest of the classes using a best of two runs scoring format. The **Snowbird** Race is a part of the Club Championships. The Snowbird is a race to "**Encourage those who are discouraged**". To qualify for the Snowbird you can't be a "fast racer" (generally A's, B's and some of the C's), a previous Snowbird winner, or a previous class winner over the past ten years. The plan this year is to run the Snowbird as a separate GS type race **after** the Club Championship races. Terry and Ed expect to set a special course for the Snowbird. We had our **Calcutta** auction at the March 9th meeting for the Snowbird. Group #1 was won by Terry Jondahl, #2 Dale Parshall, #3 Terry Walter, #4 Tom Templeton, #5 Don Clay and #6 Jack Walker.
