Terry Walter Condor Cup Race: This Saturday April 24, SVSC will host a Terry Walter Condor Cup Race at Mt Hood Meadows on Stadium. Racing starts at 10AM. Format will be 4 runs of a panel slalom. Once that is complete, weather permitting we'll reset to a conventional GS format and get 2 more runs each.

Meadows isn't doing discount racer tickets this season, and tickets must be purchased online in advance of race day. With Meadows dynamic pricing, the sooner you get your ticket the cheaper it will be. Also, Scott Morrison had free lift tickets on offer last time I checked.

As of press time, tickets are \$109 adult, \$79 senior. Please note: "snow sport specific" helmets are required at all SVSC races and training events.
