We have some race worker tickets for those without a Meadows pass. We won't be doing early load for this race, so in order to volunteer to help set the course you need to be booted up and ready to go at 8:45 AM. We will be shooting for a 10 AM race start time.

We are still working out details with Meadows and will have another email with details on discounted racer tickets in another email next week.

The Club Championships – Snow Bird
